





Annual Report for Session 2006/2007

Introduction

With much effort of Past Chairmen and Committee members, YMC has been developed into a widely recognised part of the HKIE, providing an environment for young engineers to become the pillars of the engineering profession. Currently the Committee has about 4,000 Registered Young Members from various engineering disciplines.

In this Session the Committee continued to organise activities in twelve areas through the leadership of the Committee members, including public relations, visits, students promotion, graduates promotion, seminars, non-technical programme, social, cultural & arts, sports & recreation, publicity, human resources, webmaster and community services. In particular, the Committee focused on the following areas and events:

- Increased members' exposure in the international arena by organising technical and cultural exchange events. Our immediate past chairman, Ms. Joyce Chan, was invited to speak at an international forum on women's development and economic participation in Shanghai. We have also taken part in the Conference of ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisation held in Malaysia in late November 2006 (pictured to the right) and organised an exchange trip to Macau in early December 2006. A technical visit to manufacturing factories in Dongguan was also organised.
- Broadened members' knowledge horizon by bringing different professionals to present at quality technical events. We took the lead and organised a one-day seminar on Contract Management in collaboration with young professionals in the construction industry, including engineers, surveyors, lawyers and arbitrators. The Seminar was well received by 270 members of the organising institutions.
- Organised functions with a view to increasing the youth's awareness of the engineering profession and the Institution. We acted as the technical support organisation in the 'Hovercraft design competition' organized by the Green Council. The event attracted active participations from over 100 primary and secondary schools. A boat trip had also been organised for over 200 secondary schools' students and parents to visit several major infrastructure in Hong Kong.
- Organised community services to help people in need by using the professional knowledge of young engineers. YMC has formed a team to participate in a nine-day "Education Development Programme in China" organised by Sowers Action. Young engineers used





their engineering expertise to inspect and improve the structural conditions of schools in Yunnan in Mainland China.

- Strengthened YMC's ties with university students. We facilitated the engineering students to organise technical meetings which were tailor-made for themselves. Leadership training camps and technical visits were thus organised targeting specifically at them. YMC has also taken an active role to set up the first HKIE's Student Chapter in the University of Hong Kong and would guide the Chapter's operation throughout the session 2007-2008.

The following sections summarise the activities organised by each working group, as well as other selected events held during this session:

Public Relations Group (PRG)

(Coordinator – Mr. Ken Chan)

The most valuable intangible asset of the HKIE-YMC is its brand name. With the efforts of our fellow engineers in the last decades, HKIE has built up its image of professionalism in Hong Kong, particularly in the engineering industry.

To sustain the development of HKIE, more effort is required to promote its image among other professions in Hong Kong and the Public Relations Group (PRG) is charged with this task. Based on the solid connections with other engineering institutions, the PRG focused in this session to extend the network to those non-engineering institutions. The aim is to promote the image of Engineers across different domains and enhance the personal network of our members.



In this connection, YMC approached professional education institutions to let teachers learn more about engineers. We believe this in turn can help pass the positive image of engineers on to our next generation. One of the most successful events organised was the Christmas party (pictured to the left). There were 118 participants in total, including 50 teachers from professional education institutions. With the positive feedback received, the PRG will continue to enhance YMC's network in this direction.

Visits Group (VG)

(Coordinators – Ms. Fanny Ting & Mr. Enzo Wong)

Similar to previous sessions, the Visit Group (VG) has organised various technical visits for our registered young members. These visits covered a wide range of disciplines including mechanical, industrial, electrical, environmental and civil etc, which can definitely benefit our members of different technical backgrounds.

During this session, technical visits have been arranged to Wader Engineering Ltd (pictured next page), CLP Power Quality Centre, Keystone Electric Wire & Cable Co Ltd, Kwai Chung Flatted Factory, KMB depot and HEC Lamma Wind Power Station.



All these visits were successfully held. Visit to the Dongguan Keystone Electric Wire & Cable Co Ltd was particularly special as it was the first time for VG to organise a technical visit to the Mainland China on its own. It is also encouraging that the response to the visit was positive.

VG would not have been ran so smoothly and successfully without the efforts by our helpers. Therefore special thanks are given to our helpers Alex, Cynthia, Ivan, Leo, Leon, Richard, Tommy, Xenos, David, Man-ho, Ken and Eunice for their contribution. We would also like to express our gratitude to YMC office bearer, Crystal for her advice throughout the session.

Students Promotion Group (SPG)

(Coordinator – Mr. Stephen Yip)

The goal of the Students Promotion Group (SPG) is to sustain and enhance relationships with engineering students at universities. Therefore during this session, SPG has actively participated in various activities with the students, including experience sharing sessions in orientation camps, mentorship programme, engineering nights, seminars and annual dinners (pictured to the right) organized by student unions/societies. In addition, SPG organised a “Youth presentation, communication and leadership training camp” for young members and students to enhance their competitiveness in the society. Through these activities, we have shared our experience as practicing young engineers with the students, so as to let them appreciate more about our profession.



Furthermore, we have organised various student membership promotion talks. We hope that these talks would allow engineering students to know more about the HKIE and be willing to play an active role in the institution in the future.

Another breakthrough for SPG was co-organising activities with student unions/societies. Two technical visits were successfully held. Through these visits, students could not only gain on technical knowledge, they also have opportunities to get trained on their organisation and leadership abilities.



Graduates Promotion Group (GPG)

(Coordinator – Ms. Arlene Lo)

The Graduates Promotion Group (GPG) organised something new in this session: apart from organising seminars on preparation for the professional assessment and the "Young or Ready" series seminars for graduates of different disciplines, with the support from Continuing Professional Development Committee (CPDC), we have organised a variety of events which allow graduates to fulfil their training objectives.

One example is the leadership camp, which aims at developing young engineers' perseverance, AQ, EQ, leadership and teamwork. Through experiential adventure-based activities, the training helps enhance young engineers' personal qualities and generic competence, equipping them with qualities that are essential for them to become successful professionals.



Another example is the geological field trip named "The Story of Hong Kong" (pictured to the left). This trip allows young engineers to talk confidently and knowledgeably about the landscape of the territory and inspire their understanding of the valuable natural resources available in Hong Kong. It also gives participants a chance to visit one of the most isolated and inaccessible parts of Hong Kong – Ap Chau and Kat O. During the trip, participants could see some of the oldest and youngest rocks in the territory and gain first hand experience of the effects of ancient mountain-building events.

Besides developing personal qualities, having strong communication skill is also considered important. However, having trained simultaneously in both English and Chinese since a little kid, some people may unconsciously use "Chinglish" sentences in their daily correspondence. Activity named "Get Rid of Chinglish" was thus arranged to provide participants an opportunity to understand how to speak English in a native way.

The great success of the events in this session owe in part from the resources contributed by the CPDC and the efforts by our helpers. We would like to take this chance to give our sincerely thanks to them.

Seminars Group (SG)

(Coordinators – Mr. Leo Chan & Ir Victor Lee)

In this session the Seminars Group (SG) continued with its tradition to organise seminars in various topics. We received enormous support from our members and achieved good attendance.

Fifteen technical seminars were organised throughout the session. For instance, to enhance the technical knowledge of young engineers, we organised seminars on topics such as 'digital terrestrial television broadcasting (DTTB) development in HK', 'environmental friendly design of Sham Mong Road Substation', 'Tree Preservation and Construction' and 'How to make waste management more sustainable?'.



Furthermore, recognising the need for young engineers to handle the increasingly complex projects of today, experience sharing sessions on how to be outstanding engineers/engineering managers and mainland work opportunities and work tactics had been arranged (pictured to the right). To promote safety, two half-day seminars on safety ordinances/regulations, risk management and safety management have been arranged. Through these seminars, it is aimed that the safety awareness of the participants would be enhanced. Contract administration is also important to engineers. As such, we have organised two seminars on the ‘Overview of General Conditions of Contracts for Civil engineering Works’.



We sincerely express our thanks to our helpers for their contribution on all the seminars. Moreover, your continuous support is crucial to the success of every seminar. We look forward to meeting you in our next seminar!

Non-Technical Programme Group (NPG)

(Coordinators – Ms. Mandy Leung & Ms. Krystal Wong)

This session has not only been a fruitful one for the NPG, but also a very special. There has been a breakthrough: for the first time, we have two committee members running the group.

With the generous support from CPDC, we have been able to deliver several series of continual professional development series, with good mix of seminars, workshops and visits, in various development aspects. All activities were remarked by the overwhelming response from our young engineers, and also the remarkable participation rate.

Came first was the Character Profile Workshop which was held in an atmosphere of relaxation and fun. With the aim for members to understand their own character profile as well as people around, our speaker, Mr. Steven Yeung, led members to know stereotypes of each character profile through interactive tests and work examples.



Focusing on the professional appearance for engineers, two workshops designed for training young members in table manners and building professional image (pictured to the right) were organized. From the two interactive sessions led by experienced image consultant and trainer from hotel, all participants for sure had gained tips on how to present themselves confidently and understand the social skills and appropriate dress code to suit occasions.



When counting the over subscribed applications, came first must be the aviation seminar and visit to Shek Kong airbase. Pilots and instructors from Hong Kong Aviation Club were invited to introduce the aviation activities in Hong Kong, followed by a visit to the airbase where young engineers were led to see the real flight training operation on light aircrafts and helicopters.

We have also focused on helping our fellow young members in seeking long-term success. A series of workshops, seminars and leadership camps was organized aiming to help our members to take great strides in looking beyond the immediate demands of the job and finding ways to add value by developing a few key transferable skills. We believe that this would allow one to work more efficiently, co-operate better with others and achieve a broader range of personal and business goals. We wish that with these abilities there is every chance that our young engineers will be able to climb the career ladder faster and with a surer step.

The YMC Helper's Reunion and Welcome Day was another exciting event in the year. The BBQ gathering was a golden chance for all the existing YMC helpers as well as potential helpers to meet and share experience with our committee members in organizing activities.

All in all, it has been a wonderful year for us. We hope that we will do better next year. Of course, this year's success could not possibly be achieved without the invaluable support from our guest speakers and our fellow helpers. Here, we would like to take this opportunity to express our heartfelt gratitude to all devoted helpers who have offered unceasing support throughout the year.

Social, Cultural & Arts Group (SCAG)

The goal of the Social Cultural & Arts Group (SCAG) is to broaden the horizons of young engineers to those outside the field of engineering.

Sports & Recreation Group (SRG)

In this session, Sports & Recreation Group (SRG) was heading to a new era. Two extraordinary events were explored and held in sound venues. The events also met the objectives of promoting young members' interests in the fellowship amongst all classes of members and enhancing their awareness of health and sports.

On the sports side, SRG organized a friendly football match with Macau Institute of Engineers (MacaoIE). It was the first delegation which contained both technical visits and sports. Publicity Group (PG)

2006 Shanghai International Forum on “Women’s Development and Economic Participation” – Women Engineers Forum

The 13th Young Engineers of the ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations' Conference 2006 (YEAFFEO 13)

The 13th Young Engineers of ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) Federation of Engineering Organisations' Conference 2006 (YEAFFEO 13) was successfully held in Kuala Lumpur of Malaysia from 30 November to 2 December 2006. The YEAFFEO 13 was hosted by Institution of Engineers, Malaysia (IEM). Members from YEAFFEO came from national institutions of young engineers of ASEAN countries which included Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. Besides these ASEAN countries, Hong Kong, Japan, Australia and Canada were invited to be guests of this event. Four delegates from the HKIE-YMC, namely Ir Johnson Lee (Chairman), Ms. Sally Leung (Honorary Treasurer), Ir Victor Lee (Co-opted Member) and Ms. Jenny Kwok (Past Committee Member) were honoured to represent Hong Kong to attend this conference.



The conference was commenced officially on 30 November 2006. Young engineers from all then ASEAN countries and guest countries gave a brief presentation on their organisations, past activities held and upcoming activities. Our chairman, Ir Johnson Lee represented Hong Kong to give a brief introduction on HKIE-YMC and we received cordial welcome from leaders of all other countries.

We had a technical visit to Putrajaya and Multimedia University (MMU) at Cyberjaya. Putrajaya is a planned city that acts as a federal government administration centre of Malaysia. MMU was the first Government-approved private university in Malaysia and was established in 1996. In addition, we had a historical city tour to Malacca. In the closing ceremony, we had a farewell dinner and delegates from each country conducted a five-minute performance. Four of us represented Hong Kong to sing two Chinese songs and received encouraging response from the participants.

We established a closer link to all the ASEAN countries. It was really a golden opportunity for young members of HKIE to explore more with other countries to broaden our horizon. Last but not the least, we would like to thank IEM for organising such an informative and gorgeous programme for us and we all enjoyed a memorable journey.



Exchange Trip 2006 –
Exploring the Engineering Industry in Macau

With the assistance from MacaoIE, the 2-day Exchange trip to Macau SAR, held on 9-10 December 2006, allowed more than 20 young engineers to have a closer look at Macau's engineering industry, as well as gaining a better understanding of the opportunity to develop their careers in the territory

Rich itinerary was arranged for the trip. We first jointly visited the Venetian (Cotai) Development site together with young members of MacaoIE (pictured to the right). With the courtesy of Ove Arup & Partners HK Ltd. (OAP), we witnessed Parcel One -



Hotel/Exhibition Centre of the mega project that provides over 100,000 square metres of convention, exhibition and meeting facilities, over 30 world-class restaurants and 3,000 luxury hotel suites. The site's construction has a super fast-track programme and it is targeted to be completed by July 2007. OAP engineers have explained different construction techniques that were adapted to fast track the construction programme in Macau.

The "Round-the-Island" tour guided by local experienced engineers after lunch gave us a great perspective of the historical and recent development in Macau. We also gained the insight of the booming property market and the future development of Macau. The most enjoyable part of trip was the friendly football match with MacaoIE members. Both teams enjoyed the match and we believed the friendship we have developed will last for long. The last activity of the first day was the dinner seminar. The President of MacoIE introduced the history of MacauIE and some Hong Kong engineers who are working in Macau shared their working and living experience at the table. Professors from the university showed us their cutting-edge research and described the advanced technology being developed. The exchange trip ended with some free time for members to enjoy other tourist attractions in Macau.

Alternative Dispute Resolution and

- The Chartered Institute of Building Services Engineers, Hong Kong Branch, Young Members Group;
- The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors, Young Surveyor's Group;
- The Institution of Civil Engineers, Hong Kong Association, Graduates and Students Division; and
- The Law Society of Hong Kong, Young Solicitors' Group.

The seminar also aimed to keep members of the Institutions updated on some of the hotly debated topics, including professional indemnity in the construction industry and contract management practice in the Mainland China.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the speakers invited by the organising institutions; they include Michael Charlton, Cheung Tat-tong, John Molly, Samuel Ngo and Gerry Tucker. They have shown their full support to this event from preparing the seminar handouts, advising the organising committee on various technical matters, and, finally, to give their presentations. Green Carnival 2007 – The Sixth Creative Eco-Model Tournament

YMC was delighted to be invited to co-organise the Sixth Creative Eco-model Tournament with Green Council in the Fourth Green Carnival 2007 held on 28 January 2007 at Wanchai Sports Ground. The theme of this year Eco-model Tournament was Hovercraft which was to be powered by the energy released from rubber bands. This new theme had attracted a total of 150 teams, comprising over 600 students and their teachers from primary and secondary schools in Hong Kong to compete in the Tournament for the Longest Distance Travelled Award and the Most Eco-innovative Design Award.

YMC played an important role as the technical advisor of the tournament. The tournament integrates virtually all of the skills and arts that are usually taught separately in many schools. The design project is an amalgamation of math, statistics, ethics, logic, critical thinking, arts, scientific methodology and self-learning of one





or more technical or specialty fields. Two workshops were held in November 2006 to assist the participants to teach themselves on hovercraft design. We hope that all the students participated in this event, through the competition process, could become mature, self-confident, skilled, and competitive young leaders who have career goals and the preparation, discipline, and drive to attain them.

On the tournament date, each team brought their own design hovercraft which was made of recyclable materials with a pair of standard propellers powered by rubber bands and completed in the tournament by letting their crafts travelled as far as possible on a standard 6m-long competition track.



Apart from being the technical support for the inter-school hovercraft competition, YMC had also set up a game booth to promote engineering profession in Hong Kong.

Through the display boards, participants were able to learn more on how engineers in Hong Kong contribute in environmental protection by adopting different building approaches and methods. They also enjoyed very much our game on environmental protection and they all finished with a greater a sense of appreciation of the importance of reuse and recycling.

The tournament and the booth had created enormous excitement to all participants and students. Our Chairman, Ir Johnson Lee, was invited as the judge of the tournament. We would like to take this opportunity to give our sincere gratitude to the organiser and all the helpers for their sweaty help to make the whole event so successful.

Education Development Programme – Working Group to Yunnan China

(Coordinators – Ms. Laurel Leung & Ir Crystal Ho)

Have you ever thought of studying in a school which may stumble-down any time or classrooms which are dark and in very poor conditions? In Hong Kong, a well developed city, while students are talking about setting the air-conditioned room temperature to 25.5°C, in a place not far away, children living in mountainous area in China, do not even have a chance to worry about the structural condition of their school as they have already used up all their time worrying about the fees for their schoolbooks and miscellaneous items which only amount to one to two hundred dollars annually.





During 31 March to 7 April 2007, eight young engineers divided into two teams, joined the Working Group of Sowers Action to visit 14 schools in Yunnan province. The visit included site inspection to constructing schools, structural survey to school building, dangerous school building inspection, justification on submitted cost estimate as well as interview with local students and teachers.

This activity provided us an opportunity to apply our engineering knowledge to serve those in need. It also greatly demonstrated that we could develop our personal qualities and at the same time, provide our first hand services to fulfil the society's needs. Moreover, it allowed us to practise and make engineering judgement as you may imagine the large difference in construction standard and requirement between the Mainland and Hong Kong, particularly for mountainous area, where there is lack of construction materials and resources.

Last but not least, we would like to thank Mr. Man-ho Cheung, Ms. Rebecca Ieong, Ms. Hoi-yee Lam, Mr. Jacky Lee, Mr. Edwin Leung and Mr. Hei-nok Wong for their time, effort as well as kindness of paying all expenses for this activity. The trip was tough due to unfamiliar with long travelling distance in the mountainous area, but it is worth to have participated in this activity.

Representatives in Various Committees and Divisions

Apart from organizing activities for our members, we have taken an active role in the standing committees of the HKIE. Representatives from YMC have attended meetings held by the Council, Learned Society, Community Services Committee, Continuing Professional Development Committee, Public Relations Committee, Safety Specialist Committee and sixteen divisions of the HKIE. Through our representatives, we have established strong links with HKIE members of all disciplines.


