Annual Report for Session 2008/2009

Introduction

The YMC is responsible for the promulgation of activities of a technical and social nature for young members. It provides an environment for young engineers to become the pillars of the engineering profession as well as leaders in the society. Currently YMC has about 4,100 Registered Young Members (RYM) from all 18 engineering disciplines, making it one of the largest groups within the HKIE by membership.

With the indispensable effort and support of the Past Chairmen and Committee members, YMC is now not just wisely recognised by the HKIE, but also the co-organiser other professional organisations in the society that first thought of.

Through the leadership of committee members, co-opted members and event coordinators, in this session YMC continued to organise activities in twelve areas, including student promotion, graduate promotion, technical seminar, technical visit, non-technical programme, community services, sports & recreation, public relations, publicity, webmaster and social, culture & art. In particular, YMC focused on the following aspects:

- **Enhancing members' professional knowledge**
We organised over 100 events in this session of which over 30 of them were technical seminars and visits. We broadened members' knowledge horizon by bringing different professionals to present at quality technical events. We took the lead to co-organise the One-day Seminar on Contract Management with five other young groups of professional organisation in the construction industry-including engineers, surveyors, lawyers and arbitrators.
- **Encouraging international exposure**
We increased members' exposure in the international arena by organising technical event and hosting young engineers from overseas. With funding support by the PSDAS, we co-organised with the Geotechnical Division, the Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Association of Geoconservation, an Asia-Pacific Seminar on Geological Conservation and Sustainable Development 2008 and had invited four international speakers to share with us their views on the topic. Moreover, we organised a Delegation to Dubai and sent delegates to take part in the World Engineers' Convention 2008 in Brazil and Conference of ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisation in Thailand. Apart from these, we kept hosting various young engineering organisations from overseas when they visited to Hong Kong.



- Developing close connection with engineering students
With the support from the Council and assistance from the Secretariat, YMC took an active role to assist HKIE in establishing the Student Chapters at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, City University of Hong Kong and IVE Tsing Yi and would guide them throughout the next session. We also held membership and career talks as well as visits for engineering students so as to provide them with an opportunity of experiential learning.
- Encouraging participation in community services using professional knowledge
We organised community services to help people in need by using the professional knowledge of young engineers. We took part in working group of Education Development Programme in China organised by Sowers Action. We also took an active role to help the Sichuan reconstruction of work. In these services, young members used their engineering expertise to serve the community as well as the compatriots in Sichuan.

Working Group Report

Students Promotion Group (SPG)

Engineering students are important assets of the HKIE and Students Promotion Group (SPG) is responsible to cater for the need of student members. In this session, six talks were organised in which three were membership talks to promote the HKIE to engineering freshmen and three were career talks for engineering students of different disciplines. The coverage of career talks extended to focus on how to help students to equip themselves to tackle challenges in their future career. This approach received good responses from students, practicing engineers and academic staff. Apart from it, we organised three site visits so as to provide engineering students with an opportunity of experiential learning. A Competence, Confidence and Communication Enhancement Training Camp which was jointly organised with Continuing Professional Development Committee (CPDC) and three HKIE Student Chapters, was also held in January 2009. In the Training Camp, students had the chance to identify their weakness and to improve communication skill. It is strongly believed that these activities could broaden student's horizons, improve the linkage between YMC and student and enhance their self-belonging to the HKIE.

Graduates Promotion Group (GPG)

In this session Graduate Promotion Group (GPG) organized a series of seminars aiming at providing engineering graduates with useful information and advices such that they could familiarize themselves with different training routes and well prepare for the professional assessment.

“Young or Ready Series”, the long hosted professional assessment series organised by GPG continued in this session. Four seminars were jointly organized with Joint Structural Division, Environmental Division, Electrical Division and Civil Division over the period from November 2008 to June 2009. Each seminar attracted respective group of graduate members who either are undergoing Scheme ‘A’ Training or has been working in the industry for years aiming to achieve professional recognition from the HKIE. GPG obtained support from experienced assessors and discipline representatives from divisions and the “Young or Ready Series” was well received. Participants were able to understand the available routes to be the Corporate member of the HKIE and get the knowledge on how they would be assessed in their professional interview, both resolving two of the most common questions – “How to become a professional engineer?” and “Am I having the right training focus?”.

Seminars Group (SG)

The aim of Seminars Group (SG) is to organise seminar of a multi-disciplinary in nature, with a main focus on technical subject to young members. This session eleven technical seminars were organised.

To enhance the technical knowledge of young members, SG organised seminar on topic such as “The Practice of Reinforced Soil Design and Construction in Malaysia”. To help young members to understand challenges and opportunities for career development, “Seminar on challenges facing young engineers in the 21st century” was held. Topics on safety such as “International Conference on Utility Management & Safety (ICUMAS)” and “Occupational Safety and Health in Hong Kong” were held in order to raise the safety awareness of young members. Moreover, to facilitate young members’ understanding on dispute issues in construction industry and best practices in construction management, seminars including “ Use of Mediation in Construction Industry”, “Recent Updates on Alternative Dispute Resolution” and “Value Management in Construction” were organized. SG also organised a joint seminar with Institution of Civil Engineer (Hong Kong Branch) – Graduates & Students (ICE(G&S)) to share their learning from Japan on implementation of green technology to develop distinct.

Visits Group (VG)

For instance, we organised a visit to Hong Kong University



where an innovative reservoir is being constructed within a tunnel. The storage of the reservoir would maintain the water supply in the western district of Hong Kong Island. Technical visits to Sha Tin Water Treatment Works and Stonecutters Island Sewage Treatment Works also enhanced young members' knowledge on the treatment of portable water and wastewater. In order to enhance members' awareness of environmental issues, technical visits to EMSD headquarters as well as Former Kai Tak Airport were held. Overseas Delegation 2009 – Delegation to Dubai

Since 1991, YMC has been organising delegations to different parts of the world, including mainland China, Southeast Asia, Europe and Australia. In succession to the delegation experience in a roll, and also being one of the major events of YMC in recent years, we successfully organized another overseas delegation to Dubai for this session. Jointly organized with CPDC, the delegation took place from 20 to 26 March 2009. We had the honour to have invited 7 distinguished senior members from the HKIE as our advisors, among

them, Ir Peter WONG, President of the HKIE and Ir Gray KO, our Co-opted Member from Council, joined the delegation team to Dubai and led us to kick off the core program of the delegation, together with our 16 young engineers.

The Theme for this Dubai Delegation 2009 was “Engineering Miracles”. We explicitly developed three areas of focus for our study, namely Town Planning, Infrastructure Development and Innovative Projects. The main programme of the delegation included meetings with engineering professional bodies and related public organisations, and visits to engineering infrastructures and plants such as Burj Dubai, Palm Island and Metro Dubai, which all are easy-to-name top tier engineering miracles. The highlight was surely the technical inductions conducted by prominent engineers from respective projects. We also organized meeting with Society of Engineers - United Arab Emirates and gatherings with fellow engineers from Hong Kong (currently working in Dubai) and local engineers.

In addition, a series of local seminars and visits were conducted to enrich young members’ knowledge on town planning, infrastructure development and innovative project in Hong Kong, and most importantly to provide a platform for the delegation team to learn more on these areas for their preparation for sharing with engineers in Dubai.

A delegation presentation with a delegation report detailing our learning from Dubai will be ready in mid-June 2009. Delegates will present findings from the delegation and draw analogies with the Hong Kong practices. As a token of thanks, we will also send complimentary delegation report copies to all



hosting organisations and companies in Dubai as well as leading engineering organisations and companies in Hong Kong.

We would like to express our greatest gratitude to all honourable advisors, sponsored companies and delegates for their full support to make this delegation to Dubai happened with such a big success. YMC will continue to organize other delegation for creation of learning opportunity in the future.

The Third World Engineers' Convention (WEC 2008)

The World Engineers' Convention (WEC) was initiated by the World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO), of which HKIE is a member, to gather engineering professionals from around the world for information exchange and knowledge sharing for the betterment of the profession. It is held every four years.



The Third World Engineers' Convention (WEC2008) was held in Brasilia, the capital city of Brazil, from 2 to 6 December 2008. More than 5,000 engineers, including 1,300 young engineers, from 40 countries attended. Three representatives from the YMC, namely Ir Crystal HO, Ms Sally LEUNG and Mr Leo CHAN attended the Convention.

The theme of the convention was "Engineering: Innovation with Social Responsibility", with sub-themes related to education, environment, development and the UN's Millennium Development Goals. During the convention, seminars and workshops related to these themes were held.



In addition, a Students and Young Engineers Forum was held along side the Convention. During this forum, exchanges were made with young engineers from different countries, including Brazil, Germany and Australia. We are pleased to report that the YMC Australia Delegation 2008 and YEAFEO 2007 were quoted as an example at the forum of how interactions between young engineers have transcended boundaries. Another topic discussed was the idea of setting up a Young Engineers International (YEI) platform to coordinate the voice

of young engineers around the world. The YMC had showed interest in participating in the YEI initiative, and would render support as deemed necessary.

During the Convention, Ir Crystal HO and Ms Sally LEUNG also attended the Women's Forum on behalf of the HKIE. The theme of the Forum was "Women's Role in Engineering: Perspectives and Challenges". Its goal was to evaluate the women engineers' participation in the world. Aspects such as politics, economy, culture and social responsibility had been discussed.

The 26th CAFEO and 15th YEAFEO

We took the coach together with and arranged by delegates from the Institution of Engineers - Malaysia, to Kuala Lumpur then took the flight back to Hong Kong. Although the Conference was affected by the political situation in Thailand, it was a great conference for young engineer to broaden their horizon and gain international exposure.

One-Day Seminar on Contract Management 2009

The challenging environment in managing different types of engineering contracts has inevitably brought about a wide range of contractual and legal issues in the construction industry. To provide a platform for practitioners to share experience, address problems and explore new practice in these issues, a committee comprising young engineers, solicitors, surveyors and arbitrators from six professional bodies including The Chartered Institute of Building Services Engineers (Hong Kong Branch) - Young Members Group, The Institution of Civil Engineers (Hong Kong Association) - Graduates and Students Division, The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors - Young Surveyor's Group, The Law Society of Hong Kong - Young Solicitors' Group, The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (East Asia Branch) - Young Members Group, and The Hong Kong Institution of Engineers - Young Members Committee was formed to co-organise the one-day seminar on 31 January 2009 at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

We were privileged to have invited a panel of distinguished speakers from different disciplines sharing with us various contract management issues such as procurement strategy, construction arbitration and mediation, project risk management and time audit. This year, we also invited a speaker to share with us constructing sustainable cities which is a relatively new but hot topic on sustainability issues. It gave our young members a different perspective of thoughts on the construction industry.

The seminar was very well received with a full house of 220 participants. This demonstrated the united efforts of young professionals practicing in the construction industry in organizing a good quality event.

512 Reconstruction Efforts

The Sichuan earthquake on 12 May 2008 could never be forgotten. It not just devastated many villages in Sichuan but also broke our hearts. As a leading young engineers body, YMC is committed to assist in the rebuilding efforts. The following is a recap of the activities done in this regard:

Efforts within the HKIE

YMC have participated in different Task Groups setup by the HKIE, including Task Force on 512 Earthquake Relief (this task force was dissolved upon completion of the relief period), the HKIE 512 Reconstruction Task Force with main focus on providing professional advices and reviews to the HKSAR to their direct projects under the Sichuan reconstruction trust fund, and the HKIE Task Force on Fund Raising for Sichuan Earthquake Recovery. We have also joined with five other divisions of the



HKIE to provide technical support to a non-government organisation, namely Sowers Action in their two reconstruction of school projects approved by the HKSAR's trust fund.

Efforts in Sichuan



Committee members of the YMC joined over six caring visits to Sichuan. These visits, which were organized by the “512 Young Engineers Alliance”, took us to some of the hardest hit areas including Yingxiu (映秀鎮), Shifang (什坊市), Mianzhu (綿竹市), Dujiangyan (都江堰) and Deyang (德陽市). At each visit, members participated in different relief activities. It included distributing supplies to the locals, inspecting the reconstruction of a primary school funded by the Alliance (Yuenjia Primary School at Deyang) and bringing hope to students at Yingxiu Primary School through game playing. In addition, two committee members participated in the Alliance’s “1 to 1 Mentorship Scheme” in which they made friends with a primary student at Yuenjia Primary School through regular letter exchanges.

Representatives in Various Committees and Divisions

Apart from organising activities for our members, we have also taken an active role in various standing committees of the HKIE. Representatives from YMC attended meetings held by the Council, Learned Society Board, Community Services Committee, Continuing Professional Development Committee, Public Relations Committee, Safety Specialist Committee and seventeen Divisions of the HKIE. Through our representatives, we have established excellent tie and strong relationship with HKIE members of all disciplines.

Conclusion

Session 2008/2009 has been a fruitful one for YMC. A variety of activities from all aspects were conducted with excellent quality. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all committee members, co-opted members, event coordinators and helpers for their supports and contributions throughout this session. We will continue to provide diversity services to all young members particularly RYM.

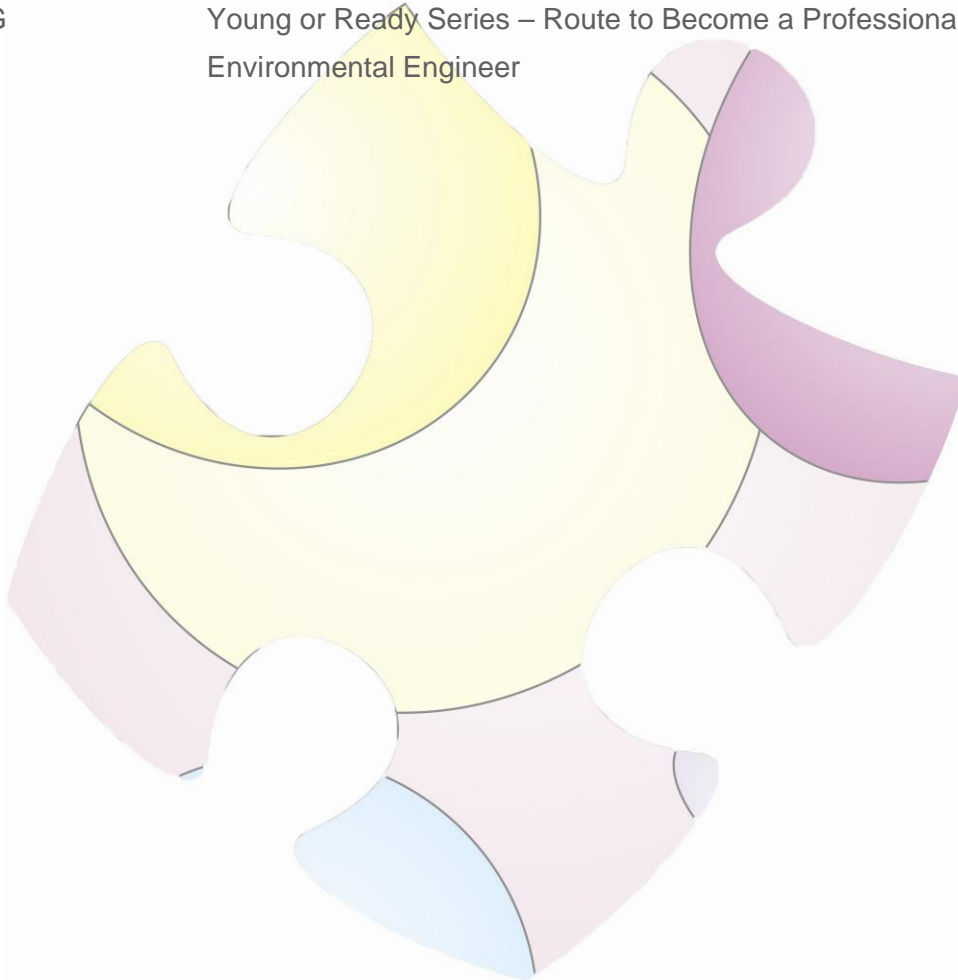
