Message from Chairman

Introduction

The HKIE-YMC was established in 1985 and its vision throughout is to serve the need of young members and nurture young engineers to become future leaders in the engineering industry, the society and the international. With over five thousand Registered Young Members (RYMs) from 21 engineering disciplines, the HKIE-YMC stands alone as one of the most prominent young engineers' bodies in Hong Kong.

To facilitate the young engineers in tackling the various challenges in the work place and the daily life as well as caring the community, we organized a series of events with the theme "Engineer a Better Community; We Learn and We Share" in this session. With advices from past chairmen, leadership from committee members, co-opted members and event-coordinators and efforts from helpers, we have fulfilled the three goals namely Professional Development, Personal Enrichment, and Community Engagement under the theme.

Professional Development

As a learned society, we continued to organize series of technical seminars and visits to broaden members' knowledge by bringing different professionals to present at quality events. We also increased members' exposure in the international arena by organizing overseas delegation and mainland delegation. We organized an Overseas Delegation to New Zealand and Mainland Delegation to Shandong. Moreover, we hosted various events for young engineering organizations from overseas when they visited Hong Kong.

Personal Enrichment

In addition to technical competence, we encouraged members' personal development by organizing various work-life balance programme from soft skills to leisure events. Under this goal, we organized Golden Life Series including numbers of events by non-technical programmes group, sports and recreation group and social culture & arts group.

Community Engagement

After "Learning" engineering knowledge and soft skills, we "Share" it to our community. We organized various community services such as mentorship programme to help the underprivileged, elderly visits and activity with the ethnic minority group.

With the help and support from the HKIE, the HKIE-YMC took an active role in providing guidance to the eight student chapters. We also held membership and career talks, visits, and leadership training camp for engineering students so as to provide them with an opportunity to learn more about the industry.

Apart from organizing activities for our members, we have also taken an active role in various standing committees of the HKIE. Representatives from the HKIE-YMC attended meetings held by the Council, Learned Society Board, Planning Committee, Community Service Committee, Continuing Professional Development Committee, Public Relations Committee, Safety Specialist Committee and nineteen divisions of the HKIE. Through our representatives, we have established strong relationships with the HKIE.

It is another fruitful year for the HKIE-YMC. We have organized a variety of activities from all aspects with excellent quality and met the needs of our members. 4.4 VISITS GROUP

Being one of the most fruitful groups in bringing technical visits to our members in the Session 2013/14, Visits Group (VG) targeted to echo the global trend of sustainable development, transportation hub, as well as some hot topics like severe weather and fuel mix.

On sustainable development, we had our fingers on the pulse of the city. We drew comparison on how the EcoPark and the Chemical Waste Treatment Centre took initiatives in treating various wastes and utilizing resources. Innovation against

environmental problems formed a key part in our topics of study. We brought the members to visit the District Cooling System at Kai Tak Development Area which is the engineering contribution to higher energy efficiency behind the cruise hub. Besides, we held a visit to the Holiday Inn Express Hong Kong SoHo which features various green awards like US LEED, HK BEAM Plus and so on



An excellent transportation network would be a pre-requisite in developing and reinforcing Hong Kong as a hub among the Asian cities. On land, we visited the MTRC Operation Control Centre which participants could have a feel on how the Transit System handles massive numbers of passengers every day. Over the sky we found ourselves at the New Civil Aviation Department Headquarters, while we went to the Hongkong United Dockyard to have a closer look at our marine transportation. What's more, the newly opened Kai Tak Cruise Terminal has been visited as well.


Severe weather is one of the threats to us. Recalled a heavy storm with hails which struck Hong Kong, together with failure in drainage system which flooded a big shopping mall in Hong Kong, we realized drainage and piping would be a hot topic for visits. We brought our young members to visit the Lai Chi Kok Drainage Tunnel as well as Sewage Interception Scheme in Kowloon City. Furthermore, a Water Mains Rehabilitation Project has been touched upon.

Another hot issue would be fuel mix which every one of us is involved with. We took initiative to bring our young members to CLP Black Point Power Station, Lamma Winds which is the unique commercial wind turbine currently in Hong Kong, Town Island

where plenty of solar panels were installed, as well as CLP Nuclear Resources Centre where members could know more on this debatable source of energy. We hope our members could have a glimpse of various sources of electricity.





Singapore visiting Hong Kong enriched the series of events for VG. Playing host to the foreign visitors, VG arranged a visit to MTR XRL Contract 823B (Shek Kong Stabling Sidings and ERS).

In this session, we organised a total of 17 visits that ranged from active construction sites to power plants and to public works plants. Our visits covered multi-disciplinary projects that satisfied the need of our members from different engineering backgrounds. Without the generous support from different parties on the visits, VG couldn't have brought the events to success. VG would like to express gratitude towards the host companies, organizations, office bearers, fellow VG helpers and other helping hands from the Committee for assisting the working group in creating a rewarding year.



YMC OVERSEAS DELEGATION 2014 TO NEW ZEALAND -Perfection in Synergy of Nature & Technology (March 28 - April 6, 2014)

Since 1991, the Young Members Committee (YMC) of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (HKIE) has organized delegations to various parts of the world, ranging from Australia, Dubai, Denmark, the UK, Canada to Germany. These delegations arouse young engineers' potential in leadership and motivate their vision to learn from overseas good practices. This year, the HKIE-YMC jointly organized a delegation to New Zealand from 28 March 2014 to 6 April 2014 with the HKIE-CPDC. 行程的第一站是濟南市。 有「泉城」美譽 的濟南作為中國第二人口大省及經濟第三



強省的省會,把握著山東省的高速發展,並按照「十二五」城市總體規劃要求,加快開<mark>拓市內</mark>新城區。 我們在了解東部新區的未來佈局理念和策略之同時,亦到過山東建築大學參觀了一系列舊建築物以平 移方法整幢搬遷的項目,見識到當局對保育的認真。 行程中,我們發現山東省內有不少地方善用當地 充分的陽光,在屋頂上配置了太陽能數水器及在高樓商品房的外牆上安裝了太陽能板。

HKIE-YMC MENTORSHIP SCHEME

As we had a successful mentorship scheme with the Boys' & Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong (BGCA) in past few years, YMC has continuously launched the mentorship scheme with the support from BGCA. In this event "HKIE-YMC Mentorship Scheme 2013/2014", one-year 1-1 mentorship services have been provided by 20 selected young engineers to young students aged from 10 to 16 from disadvantaged background. Each participating child (mentee) will be assigned with a volunteer personal mentor.



Mentors will help the children draw up and implement their personal development plans, and share their life experience with the children. On the other hand, all the mentors would be provided by the HKIE-YMC and BGCA different training programmes, which cover topics such as self-awareness, personal development and financial management, etc., to help participating children formulate and implement their personal development plans.

The focus for this year of the personal development plan is looking for their dream. Base on "REMAP", participating children can find their way for future. REMAP stand for R-Resources, E-Experience, M-Motivation, A-Ability and P-Personality. Mentors share these five basic intangible assets among other mentors and children to help them achieve their goals in this plan.

The programme is started from end of 2013. A workshop organized by BGCA in November to let social workers to match up each mentors with mentees. A one-day camp was organized for mentors to have the first time meeting with mentees in January. By different games in the camp, mentors could build up friendship with mentees. Mentors reviewed the experience in one-day camp during the workshop in February and prepared the one-day visit to Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) in March. The mentors and mentees from all groups met for a kick-off event for this programme in April to build up a long term friendship during the scheme.

The public will be able to appreciate the creativity and innovation by the younger generation of engineers.
